### More about us

AFO council is made up of 15 volunteer professionals with careers spanning a variety of ornithological vocations. Our current council members hail from the US, Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, and Mexico. AFO publishes the internationally recognized *Journal of Field Ornithology* and owns <u>Avinet Research Supplies</u>, producing and selling the highest quality avian research supplies anywhere.

### About the conference

The Association of Field Ornithologists meets annually, and often jointly with other ornithological societies from North and/or South America. In 2025, we decided to host our own meeting as a celebration of the contributions of our society to field ornithology.

This year's meeting will offer a series of workshops, symposia highlighting emerging issues in field ornithology, plenary talks by leading experts, and as always a full and rigorous scientific program of poster and oral presentations. Throughout the conference, there will be opportunities to participate in field and career training/advancement events particularly focused on students and early career professionals. The scientific program runs July 30 through August 1.

### Our attendees

About half of our attendees hold advanced degrees and usually conduct bird-related research at universities, natural history museums, bird-banding stations, state and federal agencies, with interests in conservation and the biology of wild birds. Our meetings also strongly support the attendance of students and amateur ornithologists, which account for approximately the other half of the attendees. **We expect 200-250 people to register for this meeting**; most of them from the US, although we frequently have attendees from Argentina, Brazil, and Canada.

### Location

Our 2025 meeting will be held in Ogden, UT. Ogden is located ~10 miles east of the Great Salt Lake and served as a major railroad hub for most of its history. Ogden is home to Weber State University and has a vibrant historic district. Nestled at the foot of the Wasatch Mountains, Ogden serves as a gateway to several national parks including Grand Teton and Yellowstone to the north and Arches, Zion, and Bryce Canyon to the south. Locally, Antelope Island State Park and Bear River Wildlife Refuge host millions of shorebirds during the breeding season making this an excellent staging area for birders.

### General Sponsorship Descriptions

### Coffee break sponsorship

Science runs on snacks and coffee. Therefore, we will offer all day beverage (coffee, tea, soda, water) service and two "snack breaks" per day during the three days of the scientific program. Each sponsorship covers a half day of refreshment service. We can accommodate up to six (6) coffee break sponsors.

### Student travel support

Funds will be allocated to provide financial assistance to students and early career professionals presenting at the meeting. These awards are particularly valuable for those traveling from outside of the US, where access to support from home institutions may be extremely limited. Travel awards are allocated through a competitive application process in which funds are awarded based on merit and expressed need.

### **Event transportation**

Transportation is needed for 1) morning field trips and 2) our social event at the Ogden Nature Center. We will offer local birding field trips prior to the start of the scientific program each day (July 30-Aug 1). We expect attendees to participate each morning, which will require shuttle service to and from local birding hotspots around Ogden.

We are also seeking funding to cover the cost of bus transportation of attendees to the social event at the Ogden Nature Center on July 31. We estimate needing 1-2 motor coaches to transport attendees the ~8 mile round trip from the conference center to the nature center. We can accommodate up to four (4) transportation sponsors.

### Early morning field trip guides (July 30-Aug 1)
